

### Vendor Spotlight: Gabe Rapini



#### 1- UNDER ARMOUR.

Gabe Rapini is an independent sales representative. He has been in the sales industry all his working career and loves it. Gabe has been an avid golfer for over 30 years and tries to get out at least 2x's per week if the weather cooperates. He is a member at the Weston Golf Club in Toronto which ranks in the top forty golf clubs in Canada. Weston Golf Club is also the first course where Arnold Palmer won a PGA tournament. For Gabe, being a golfer and working in sales for golf products is a perfect match.

Gabe has been representing Under Armour Products for 8 years. When he started there were only two accounts in Ontario and now there are over 150. When Under Armour added golf apparel and accessories to their line, sales went through the roof. They have had double digit growth for the last 8 or 9 years. This growth has created a lot of travel for Gabe, but he loves all of it. Especially dealing with his clients and helping support their needs.

A little Under Armour history: Under Armour was started by Kevin Plank in 1996. Kevin started to develop a clothing line during his university days in his grandmother's basement. He got tired of dealing with shirts soaked with sweat after playing sports. However, what he did notice is that his compression shorts stayed dry. This inspired him to make a T-shirt using moisture-wicking synthetic fabric (his first trial was with women's undergarments!). Kevin developed his first prototype of the shirt, which he gave to his Maryland teammates and friends who had gone on to play in the NFL. They loved it and other teams started to notice. Kevin soon improved the design, creating a new T-shirt built from microfibers that wick moisture away. From then on, his company started, and it's been a success ever since with continual growth. You can see their products worn by ambassadors such as Maverick McNealy who in 2017 was the number one ranked golfer in the World Amateur Golf Ranking and Jordan Speith, a professional golfer on the PGA Tour and former world number one in the Official World Golf Ranking. He is a three-time major winner and the 2015 FedEx Cup champion.

Gabe is a busy man, not only does he represent Under Armour, he also is the Rep for Wilson Sporting Goods. At one time Wilson was the #1 Golf brand. Over time with changes in management the ranking changed, but they are on a comeback. With a younger management team and innovative ideas, Wilson is gaining ground once again.

Wilson Sporting Goods has an amazing history: Starting before 1913 under a different name they owned a meat packing slaughterhouse. Using animal by-products, they started making tennis racket strings, violin strings, & surgical sutures. They then expanded to baseball shoes and tennis racquets. From there the company has many major milestones. From supplying uniforms to the Chicago Cubs and developing the leather football. They also introduced the baseball catcher's mitt, and waistline football pants with pads. They started developing golf clubs and golf balls as early as 1932. They have been the official ball supplier of the NFL since 1941 and CFL since 1995 and continue to do so. They are also the official game ball supplier for the NBA and WNBA since the 2021 season. Wilson Staff is the golf division of Wilson Sporting Goods. The company designs and manufactures a full range of golf equipment. Many of the world's top professional golfers have used Wilson equipment including Nick Faldo, Arnold Palmer and Ben Crenshaw. It's hard to find a sport that Wilson is not part of.

Of course, let's not forget the most famous Wilson. A Wilson volleyball "co-starred" alongside Tom Hanks in the film Cast Away. Wilson Sporting Goods actually created and marketed special edition volleyballs with Wilson's "face" printed on.

There's still more ... Gabe also represents Danini Men's Golf Fashion Line. A high-end men's golf clothing line which is primarily showcased at private clubs.

# Community Day Charity Spotlight: Amanda Detmar Woodview Mental Health and Autism Services

This month I had the opportunity to interview Amanda Detmar of Woodview Mental Health and Autism Services. Amanda has been with the Woodview organization for approximately 19 years. Growing up, Amanda's father was a police officer, and she would hear about child abuse cases and decided at a young age she wanted to be more involved in helping children. She went to school for Child and Youth Worker and started in the Woodview Outreach Program working with families in their home. Amanda is now a Manager at the Brantford office which serves Brantford and parts of Brant County.

Woodview Mental Health and Autism Services have been helping families for over 60 years. There is a long history to this organization: Their roots date back to 1853 when the sisters of St. Joseph's Orphanage started St Mary's Orphanage Asylum for girls and Mount St. Joseph's Orphanage for boys.



After years of advancement in medical science, human behaviour, foster care and government agencies, the Mount St. Joseph Charter was signed and a 'Corporation governed by a Board of Directors was formed.

In 1960 was the start of the new methodology of residential and day treatment services.

In 1978 Mount St. Joseph Centre relocates to Burlington and is renamed Woodview Childrens Centre. Day treatment programs for boys and girls and a residence are added.

1980 Woodview is continually expanding and opens a residential and day treatment program in Brantford. As new treatment methods become available and better understanding of Mental Health and Autism, Woodview continues to expand with community needs.

Woodview goes above and beyond to support children and youth facing mental health challenges, and individuals with autism. They work to remove barriers to provide what is necessary in skill building, coping strategies, relationships, independence and resilience. Woodview supports children and youth up to 18 years of age (and their families) with a variety of mental health programs and services.

One of the biggest challenges is to stop the stigmatism that seems to follow those with mental health issues and to know there is help available. Woodview in Brantford is one of the lead agencies in the province.

#### Some of the programs Brantford Mental Health Services offer are:

- Counselling and outreach services.
- Caregiver support and engagement.
- Youth hub (drop-in & counselling).
- Community education and training.
- School-based adolescent day treatment.

#### Some of the Brantford Autism Services are:

- Applied behaviour analysis.
- 1:1 services in-centre and/or community.
- Family skill development in home and/or community.
- Social skills groups for kids and teens.

When asked about her involvement with Community Day, Amanda said it was amazing. Even though it was only herself and another coworker working the full day it was a great experience. Interacting with the golfers was fun and rewarding. Everyone had a question to ask or a story to share. Amanda also wanted to remind everyone that Mental Health Week is coming up and to look for events throughout the week of May 6-10. You can also check out the calendar on their website: Woodview.ca.

Favourite vehicle that you owned? Infinite – it was white and such a comfy ride.





### CORPORATE SPONSOR SPOTLIGHT: CURT STYRES

One of the Six Nations Reserve's most successful businessmen and the Owner and GM of the Halifax Thunderbirds NLL Team, Styres puts his family above all else as much as he can with a packed schedule. He is known for treating members of his teams and his employees like family.

That approach can be traced to his upbringing on the Six Nations Reservation, the most populous First Nation in Canada. As a young boy, Styres saw his mother, Vera, attend school during the day and work at night, taking on seasonal employment on local farms when the time came each year. He saw how hard she worked to better herself and her children, even as they grew into adulthood and began supporting themselves. Curt and his siblings can agree that they got their work ethic from their mother, who was widowed at a young age and had no choice but to work hard to provide for her family. Though the family suffered hard times in Styres' early years, his mother strove to ensure that her children had everything they needed to survive and that they carried themselves with dignity. By teaching them to work for what they wanted, they learned to be thankful for everything they have in life — including one another.

Curt's business background started with Grand River Enterprises in 1991, a company that exports tobacco on the Six Nations Reserve along with other business partners. In 1997 the company was incorporated and received a license from the Canadian Government to buy and sell tobacco. The factory started in a small warehouse with ten staff and has now grown 25 times in size, creating numerous jobs for hundreds of people on First Nations communities, including employees in his home community. In 2020 GRE employed a staff of 500. He has overseen Production at Grand River Enterprises as the Manager since inception and likes to be hands-on with everything he does. He since has various other businesses, including the opening of the Iroquois Lacrosse Arena in 2004, which is a facility where the game of lacrosse can be played on turf year-round.

Curt is passionate about lacrosse and growing the game on and off of his community. He has given back in many ways, from donating equipment to youth programs and coaching teams himself to Championships. Members on the reserve of Six Nations are familiar with his approach to getting a lacrosse team on a successful track. In his previous role as the lead sponsor for the Arrows Express Jr A team, Styres applied his concept of "put the tools in front of the player," resulting in a run of OLA championships from 2004 to 2007 in which year his arena hosted the Canadian Championship for the Jr As, the Minto Cup. Success seems to follow him where ever he goes as the Championships continued with his previous NLL team, the Rochester Knighthawks, who won 3 consecutive Champion's Cups 2012-2014. In 2011 and 2018, Curt was recognized for his leadership, knowledge, and commitment by the National Lacrosse League and was awarded the honour of the GM of

The Year.

He and his business partners at Grand River Enterprises started the "Dreamcatcher Foundation," a charitable organization that has awarded millions to Aboriginal-based groups that help youth across Canada achieve their scholastic and sports goals. To date, the Dreamcatcher Foundation has given to 24,000 recipients, and the number continues to grow. The Foundation holds an annual Gala in October of each year, which is an elegant night to honour individuals in sports, education, arts, and life achievements while enjoying great food and entertainment. Their office is housed at his arena along with a Private School that offers Native Language Programs in Cayuga and Mohawk, keeping the culture of the community alive.

Curt strives for greatness in everything he does, keeping the values his mother taught him close to his heart and remaining grounded in the community he loves. He is someone his community can look to for advice and guidance as he wants to see everyone get from good to great. He continues to teach those same values to his children and grandchildren, be grateful for every day, and always pay it forward.
